### Organisation's vision/mission

I-India's mission is to provide care, love and development for children living on the streets of Jaipur. Also to create a comprehensive system of services to fulfill street and working children's long-term needs for education, skills, and emotional support, as well as their short-term needs for nutrition, health and shelter.

The organization's vision is to create a nurturing environment that can foster normal physical and mental growth of street and neglected children. To allow them to return to mainstream society and eventually contribute to its development.

### About I-India:

I-India was founded in Jaipur in June 24, 1993 by the married couple Prabhakar and Abha Goswami. I-India has focused on rescuing children from lives of neglect and abuse in the streets of Jaipur. Children who benefit from the program are generally street children, homeless, orphaned or suffering in bonded labour. Over the last twenty-two years, successful programs have been developed and implemented by I-India to fulfil the chronic and urgent needs of these children.

Currently, the organization reach over 3000 children daily through its street schools, contact points/street schools, residential homes, children's village, mobile health vans, school on wheels, shower bus and vocational training centres.

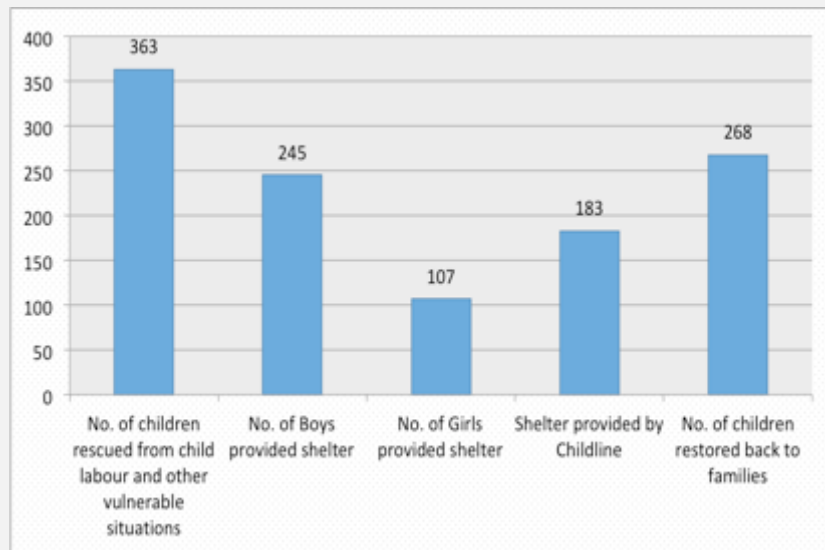


## PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN IN THE YEAR 2018-19

### Shelter & Emergency Services

#### CHILDLINE 1098

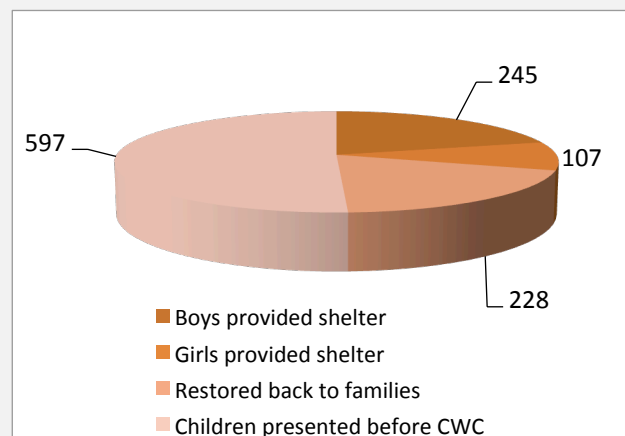
Since 1999, I-India is running Childline in Jaipur city, which is one of the first 24-hour national helpline for children in need of care & protection. The Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) and Childline India Foundation supporting and mentoring this service throughout the nation. At Childline,



Achievements of Year 2018-2019

During the year of 2018-19, our team has handled 1075 cases through this services and provided immediate care to children and support to the concerned citizens who are victims of or witness to abuse, exploitation, forced labor or are physically injured. Total 363 children have been rescued and protected from abuse and 183 children have been provided shelter through this emergency services. Our team has also provided much needed services for the 16 cases under Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO ACT). As a part of awareness generation on Child Rights, throughout the year our Childline team has also conducted open houses and awareness generation programs for students & different stakeholders.

#### HOMES



I-India is also conducting Residential centres, which are 24\*7 centres, which provides shelter (long-term or short-term) and integrated childcare services to most disadvantaged group of children, mainly – orphan, homeless, child labour and runaway children.

During the year of 2018-19, total 352 children have been provided residential care at I-India's Children's homes & Open Shelter. Other than care, these shelter homes also provided formal education, which covers preschool through high school and even college education for children

attaining adulthood. Children who have been illegally trafficked from different parts of country have also received temporary care at these shelter homes and provided legal assistance, health care & repatriation. During this year, we operated 2 children's home under Rohida project in partnership with Flowering Tree Inc, an Open Shelter for boys with the support of Social Justice and Empowerment Department and Department for Child Rights, Government of Rajasthan and Ganga (Girls) home with the support of I-AID, Saffi Foundation and Ama Mundum.

## Education Projects

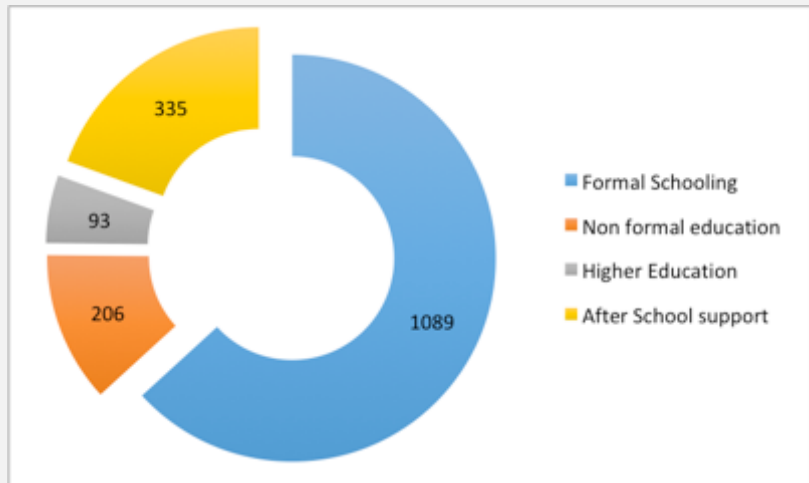
### FORMAL SCHOOLS

At I-India, our team provides formal and after-school education to most disadvantaged group of children.

We have been continuously mainstreaming number of street, slum and below poverty line village children into formal education and now their regular education, mid-day meal, water & health care services have been imparted through Senior Secondary School Prem-Pathshala based in Jhag Children's village, Prem-Pathshala

Middle Level School (supported by Dadalni Family, Singapore) and

Shwetaark Pathshala primary school in Jaipur city (in partnership with Flowering Tree Inc.), of capacity 700, 300 & 200 children respectively. In these schools, over 1100 children of all age acquired structured education through qualified teachers and skills such as: arts and music, games, dramatic performances, etc. These children also get accessed to library, science lab and necessary equipment to aid in their learning. This year, our school project at Jhag has also started student alumni for the regular follow up of students passed out from Prem-Pathshala.

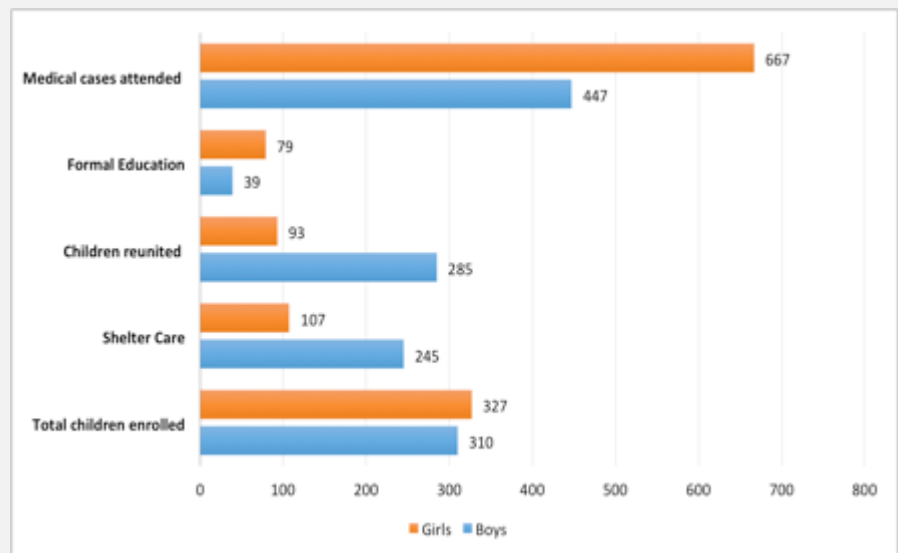
### AFTER SCHOOL SUPPORT

Our after school support is targeted at children joining formal schools as a part of mainstreaming program at street and slum communities but possibly not able to get any education support back home due to the illiteracy among family members. These centres not only provide education support but also motivate and follow up with community and children with the aims of minimizing school drop-outs. In year 2018-19, we reached out to more than 1723 children via above-mentioned educational programs.

## Intervention on Street & Slums

### CONTACT POINTS

I-India is also organizing contact points as a day care centres, which identify street children and provide child care services such as food, medical care, counselling, educational support and vocational training. The organization is running 6 Contact Points as a part of ICPS program and 2 additional contact points are located at most critical slum area and railway station of Jaipur city.

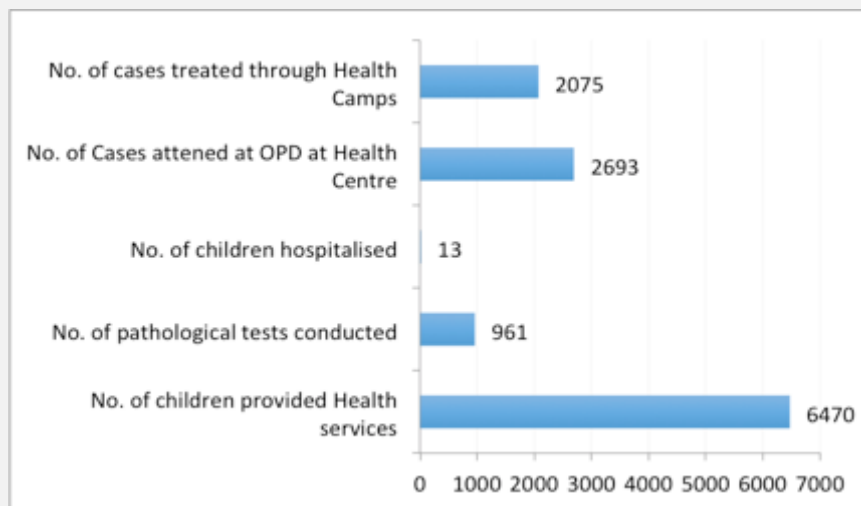

## Health Care – personal hygiene/nutrition

I-India priorities and focused on the medical and nutritional need of children living in desperate situation. The organization runs a full-fledged 6 bedded health centre in rural area and has a team of full-time trained health workers (male and female) and a doctor for implementing health services, such as: regular OPD, pathological lab, health camps and referral care for marginalized communities and especially children. As a matter of fact, the executive board of I-India also includes eminent doctors and specialists, always reachable to team on ground for health consultation and guidance.



Achievements of Year 2018-2019

In the year of 2018-19, our health care projects provided health care to 6470 children and collaborated with most reputable hospitals of Jaipur and conducted health camps for pediatrics specialties, eye check-ups and general health care both in Jaipur and Jhag based programs. This year, our Jhag based health centre sustained with the support of Mehta Family Singapore and supplementary support came from Ama Mundum, Germany.

### Daily Meals/Kitchen Project:

Our Kitchen project is providing necessary meals to the street and homeless children in Jaipur city. However, many children from our street and slum schools are now attending formal public schools and now covered under mid-day meals program of state government as well. Our own kitchen project is still ensuring daily one-time fresh meals for 1500 street and homeless children who are attending I-India's formal schools, contact points, vocational training and day care centres. Throughout the year the organization is also receiving additional number of children, rescued child labour, child beggars and missing children as a part of emergencies and it's always a basic priority and intervention to ensure that they are well fed.

### Shower Bus Project:

From past many years, our shower bus project is functioning in the areas, which severely lacks basic water supply for both drinking and general utility. However, through collective efforts of different stakeholders and government now some of these communities are able to secure public water supply and now the crisis situation is slightly improving. However, securing adequate water supply in facilitating round a clock shelter care for over 300 children, drinking water for over 1000 children in our schools and vocational training centres, water to cook food in kitchen, toilets/shower still seems challenging. Our projects are daily facing crisis of water, which is a basic and fundamental need to run a school, shelter home, health center and kitchen.

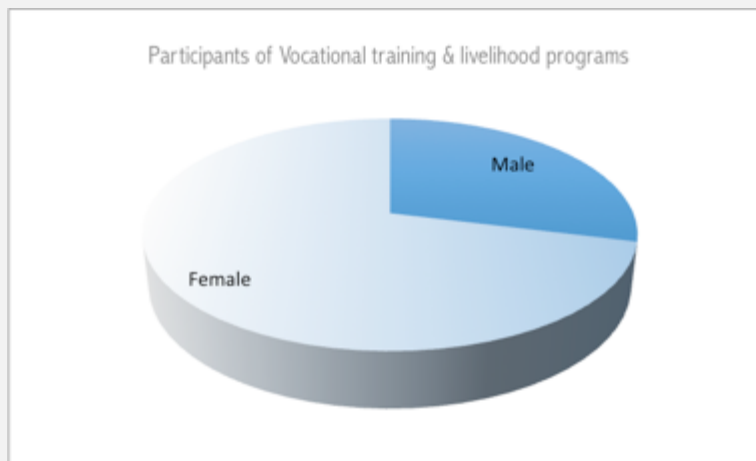

## Skill Enhancement

Our Skills Enhancement activities through three vocational training centres are continuously empowering Children attaining 18 years of age with meaningful skills through which they can secure employment and lead a life of dignity. Our team identifies, counsel and interact with the children and map their skills and capacities and suggest them suitable vocational training courses.



Achievements of Year 2018-2019

During this year, 65 male young adults and 160 female have attended hands on training at these vocational training centres on growing industries such as: Computer (IT), Handicrafts & Textile. So far, many of our participants have also successfully secured sustainable livelihood and found jobs with not only social enterprise arm Ladli but also organizations like Taj Group, Hotel Hyatt, Reliance Mart, Zomato and Mahindra. Our sustainability partner of vocational training programs for the year 2018-19 are Saffi Foundation and Ama Mundum.

## VOLUNTEER/VISITORS 2018-19

Our volunteer and visitor program is specifically designed for better facilitation of all our activities with the involvement of volunteers, interns and individuals with different skillsets. The program basically involves practical work with the projects and exposure visits for understanding the overall model. The core requirement of this program is passion and commitment towards mission of I-India coupled with a commitment of minimum four weeks.
